
DAVID POYER graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1971. His active and reserve service included sea duty in the Atlantic, Mediterranean, Arctic, Caribbean, Pentagon, and Pacific, and shore duty at Fleet Training Center, the Joint Chiefs, and Surface Warfare Development Group. Captain Poyer's last assignment was at Joint Forces Command as Senior Policy Advisor to the Vice Chief of Staff. He retired after completing thirty years of service.

His civilian employment included stints with several defense consulting firms and think tanks and work at Newport News Shipbuilding in the Submarine Design Office, concentrating on systems engineering for the SSN-721 class and conceptual studies for various advanced submarine projects.

Poyer began writing in 1976 and is the author of nearly fifty books of fiction and nonfiction, published by Simon & Schuster, Macmillan, the Naval Institute Press, and others. The most popular of his four series are the Modern Navy novels, featuring Daniel V. Lenson. These include five bestselling volumes detailing a world war with China: TIPPING POINT, ONSLAUGHT, HUNTER KILLER, DEEP WAR, and OVERTHROW. Publisher's Weekly calls them "a series like no other in the military thriller genre." His books have been required reading at the U.S. Naval Academy's "Literature of the Sea" course, along with those of Herman Melville and Joseph Conrad. His work has been translated into Japanese, Dutch, Serbo-Croatian, Hungarian, and Italian, and rights have been sold for films. Poyer was the second Naval Academy Distinguished Visiting Writer, after Jim Webb.

Poyer holds a master's degree in quantitative defense analysis from George Washington University and has taught or lectured at Annapolis, Flagler College, University of Pittsburgh, Joint Forces Staff College, Old Dominion University, University of North Florida, Jimmy Carter Presidential Library, and other institutions. He taught fiction and memoir in the MA/MFA Creative Writing Program at Wilkes University for sixteen years before retiring from teaching this year.

He's a four-decade life member of SNA, ASNE, USNAAA, and the Naval Institute, and a contributing editor of Shipmate Magazine. A fellow of the Virginia Center for the Creative Arts and the Ossabaw Writers Retreat, he currently serves on the board of the Eastern Shore Public Library. He lives on Virginia's Eastern Shore with Lenore Hart, also a much-published novelist.

Last year, due to the pandemic, the first ever virtual event was held and it was quite a success. It expanded the previous in-person local event into a national / international event with more than 550 LEGO® model participants!

ASNE TW STEM GRANT AWARDED TO ODU MATHFEST

The ASNE Tidewater Section was pleased to award a Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Grant to ODU for their Math Festival. The 'MathFest' kicked off December 11 with a "Math is Everywhere" Scavenger Hunt. Below are the details from ODU's News website.

Old Dominion University's fourth annual MathFest will consist of "Math is Everywhere" Scavenger Hunt that begins Dec. 11 across Hampton Roads. Due to the pandemic, this year's MathFest transitioned from a one-day event to the scavenger hunt that will run through the end of December. It is designed to show students in grades 3-8 how they'll use math in real life by demonstrating "Math is Everywhere" in our community.

Participants will be able to visit locations on their own time and will be eligible to register for a drawing for an Amazon Fire Kids Pro Tablet.

Students in the "Math is Everywhere" Scavenger Hunt will receive an event passport. As they complete activities, their passports can be stamped, and they'll be able to collect MathFest goodies (while supplies last).

While MathFest goodies and activity materials are free, participants should be prepared to pay an entry fee at each of the locations and abide by facility rules and regulations.


