

ASNE TW NEW ONLINE PAY PROCEDURE AND DINNER PRICING

New Online Pay Procedure

As of July 1st, ASNE TW has a new on-line credit card payment procedure. PayPal will no longer be available as a third-party payment system. We will now be processing on-line payments for ASNE TW dinner / event RSVPs using a credit or debit card.

Background:

The Section utilizes a data base system called Wild Apricot to manage our membership functions such as dinner RSVPs, e-mails, chapter news, posting photos of events and newsletters. Although PayPal was an option to pay on-line with Wild Apricot, there was a significant cost involved (we paid a 20% annual premium to use PayPal). Payments by credit or debit cards will save the TW chapter hundreds of dollars per year.

Procedure:

Under the Wild Apricot payment system, when members click the Pay Online button after registering for an event, they will be able to immediately make a payment with a credit card or debit card at the Wild Apricot website. Members will no longer be required to leave the ASNE TW website, log-on to PayPal to make a payment, and then return to the TW Section site. Further, after your card information has been entered into the system, members can choose to save their payment information for future transactions, enabling a “one-click” checkout feature.

Security:

Wild Apricot on-line payments will be powered by AffiniPay, a payment gateway that specializes in payment solutions for non-profit associations like ASNE. AffiniPay has over a decade of experience in the payment industry, with an A+ rating from the Better Business Bureau. Both AffiniPay and Wild Apricot Payments are fully PCI compliant.



Note that AffiniPay is only used for membership payments and not payments to commercial vendors for purchases. For security reasons, credit card information is not stored in Wild Apricot. Instead, it is securely transmitted to AffiniPay where it is processed. AffiniPay then returns the status of the payment transaction, which is recorded in your Wild Apricot transaction details.

New Dinner/Meeting Pricing

Our dinner price is increasing starting this September. We have been very fortunate to keep our price steady for the past five years and make every attempt to minimize costs to our members. However, the cost for dinners at the hotel has increased and we must raise our price. We hope you understand.

RADM Mark Hugel, USN(Ret.) is the Senior Vice President, Submarine Logistics & Product Lifecycle Campaign for CACI International, Inc. He was commissioned in June 1977 after earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Systems Engineering from the United States Naval Academy. He was accepted into the Navy Nuclear Propulsion Program and was subsequently assigned to sea tours in USS ENTERPRISE (CVN 65), USS MISSISSIPPI (CGN 40) and USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN (CVN 72). While assigned to MISSISSIPPI, he was designated a Surface Warfare Officer and during his tour in ABRAHAM LINCOLN, he was accepted for lateral transfer into the Navy's Engineering Duty Officer Program.

In June 1992, Rear Admiral Hugel completed his graduate education at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, earning a Master of Science degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering, and a Master of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering. He subsequently served in acquisition, shipbuilding and ship maintenance tours at Supervisor of Shipbuilding, Newport News, Virginia and Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Portsmouth, VA.

In his third tour at Norfolk Naval Shipyard, he was the 100th Shipyard Commander. After promotion to Flag rank, he was Deputy Director for Fleet Readiness on the Chief of Naval Operations staff, and his last active duty assignment was as Deputy Commander, Logistics, Maintenance and Industrial Operations (SEA04), at the Naval Sea Systems Command. After retiring from the Navy in 2009, he began his employment with CACI and was selected to lead CACI's Norfolk, Virginia office. During his tenure at CACI, he was initially the Division Group Manager and Operating Group Manager for Navy Logistics, and subsequently led the initial stand-up of the Logistics and Material Readiness (LMR) market team.



His current assignment is as Senior Vice President and leader of CACI's Submarine Logistics and Product Lifecycle Management campaign team, continuing his lifelong work as a logistics and maintenance professional.

ASNE TW ODU CHAPTER UPDATE

The ASNE Tidewater ODU Student Chapter competed in the Promoting Electric Propulsion (PEP) event at MACC in July. The student team began the project before the pandemic in 2020 and were not able to complete it until recent months. Promoting Electric Propulsion (PEP) for Small Craft is an ASNE-sponsored educational and competitive program to foster the development of electric boats in the U.S.

The PEP competition is held at the USCG Yard in Baltimore and qualifying vessels for the competition are any manned or unmanned vessel operating with an electric propulsion system. Each boat has to complete several laps defined by buoys in Curtis Bay. The ODU Student Chapter of ASNE Tidewater Section finished their project and competed in the race, finishing 4th out of 11 schools! Congratulations to **Neil St. Clair** and **Daniel Erdogan** who overcame many obstacles, including a few challenges/delays the day of the event! This team gave 110% to their project and deserve a great deal of recognition. SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS 2021-2022

The American Society of Naval Engineers began its scholarship program in 1979 in order to promote the profession of naval engineering and to encourage college students to enter the field. Since the inception of the Scholarship Program, ASNE has since awarded hundreds of scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students interested in pursuing an education and career in naval engineering.

Though rooted in tradition, a constant push for more power and efficiency, the application and development of cutting-edge technology, modern warfare and issues related to national security have aided the evolution of naval engineering. Today, naval engineering includes most engineering disciplines as they are applied to a naval specialty and has become a challenging and rewarding career field in high demand. Each year, rising Junior and Senior undergraduate and graduate students nationwide can receive up to \$4,000 based on merit (academic record, work history, and professional interest in naval engineering) and financial need.


