Captain Dianna Wolfson is currently serving as the 110th Commander of Norfolk Naval Shipyard in Portsmouth, VA.

Wolfson graduated from the United States Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, New York in 1996 where she received a Bachelor of Science degree in Marine Systems Engineering (Magna Cum Laude) and was commissioned in the Nuclear Power Officer Candidate Program.

Wolfson received her surface warfare qualification aboard USS George Washington (CVN 73). She subsequently became an engineering duty officer and received a Master of Science degree in Civil and Environmental Engineering and a Naval Engineer's Degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 2004.

Her nuclear engineering duty officer tours include qualification at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, Main Propulsion Assistant on USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70) during the arduous testing phases of its Refueling Complex Overhaul and Force Maintenance Officer at Commander, Naval Air Force Atlantic, where she was responsible for developing and executing a \$362 million public and private sector budget and execution strategy to support both depot level and emergent repairs for five aircraft carriers.

She also served as the Project Superintendent for the USS Newport News (SSN 750) Engineered Overhaul, a complex depot-level availability conducted near the mid-point of a submarine's service life at Norfolk Naval Shipyard, RCOH Project Officer at Supervisor of Shipbuilding Newport News where she successfully delivered USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN 72) while simultaneously planning the RCOH for both George Washington and USS John C. Stennis (CVN 74) totaling over \$9.5 billion in contracts.

Wolfson was selected in 2017 as Operations Officer at Norfolk Naval Shipyard responsible for planning, leading, and driving the execution of overhauls of nuclear powered aircraft carriers, submarines, conventional surface ships, nuclear moored training ships and inactivation activities to include CNO availabilities, off-yard activities and deployed assets.

Prior to taking command at Norfolk Naval Shipyard, she served as the 50th Commander of Puget Sound Naval Shipyard & Intermediate Maintenance Facility as well as the Northwest Regional Maintenance Center, Bremerton, Washington from June 2019 to December 2020.

Her personal decorations include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal (four awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (two awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (four awards) and a number of unit awards.

Best yet, the **ASNE-Sika Ultimate Build-A-Boat Challenge** will be showcased **June 11-12, 2022** as we celebrate the 26th Anniversary of this great event! There is no entry fee for the teams, but personal donations to help cover the cost for this event, and support the ASNE mission, are encouraged and greatly appreciated.

This competition combines creativity, craftsmanship and boat handling skills in a unique event that is both challenging and entertaining. Below are some of the details and here is a [link](#) to **more specific instructions for Boatbuilders**, also located on our [website event page](#).

- IT'S FREE... no entry fee for participants. The *American Society of Naval Engineers* (ASNE) and *Sika Corp* are the Event Sponsors.
- Construction material kits are predefined and provided to teams at no cost.
- Space is limited. Twenty-five (25) two-person teams will be accepted, on a first-come basis.
- Teams submit application early to secure a spot, and later submit their design 2 weeks in advance.
- Bring your own power tools, hand tools, a smile, family and friends and a great attitude.
- The building & outfitting phases take place on Saturday. Arrive by 8:30 am, finish around 5:00 pm. Stay for the evening concerts and fireworks if you can... it's a blast.
- Races (3 heats) take place on Sunday. Plan to arrive at 1:00 pm for a catered lunch; finish around 5:00.
- Awards will be presented for Best Design, Fastest Built, Race Results 1st – 3rd Place, Most Whimsical, and Fan Favorite. We reserve the right to create other categories as we feel inspired.
- Prizes include Sikaflex Trophies, commemorative medals, bling and power tools!
- Building time is limited to 4 hours (but we do not enforce this. It's a guideline... just be safe!).
- Painting the boat is critical to ensure structural integrity during the water-born portion of the event. And beyond a basic coat of paint, creative decorating (outfitting) is absolutely encouraged. Decorating can start immediately upon completion of the boat construction. Families, friends and supporters are welcome to help decorate after your power tools are safely put away.

The American Society of Naval Engineers will commit 100% of net proceeds to funding the mission areas of ASNE, including engineering scholarships and STEM programs.

ASNE SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION UPDATE

Members,

The ASNE National Scholarship Committee (12 Members) just completed the review and final selection process of the 2022-2023 scholarship applications, with the following national and local results:

- There were 22 finalist applications evaluated and ranked by the full committee
- There were 14 fully funded (\$4000.00) scholarships available
- The committee selected 14 candidates for scholarship award

Promoting Electric Propulsion (PEP):

- ODU PEP team has received a new powertrain for their 2022 boat!
- **Daniel Erdogan**, team lead, has been working vigorously to get the boat to the competition. He has heavily modified the motor to work with the speed tail drive system. Daniel also plans to bring back the water jacket idea to cool down and prevent the motor from overheating.
- **Larry Price**, returning member and Electrical Engineer, is aiding the team with efforts of wiring the motor and running it.
- **Jacob Hightower**, team co-lead, is working on strategies to attach the 60-pound motor and its drivetrain to the boat; he plans to use rubber as an insulating agent to decrease vibrations which may negatively impact performance.
- **Dylan DiBari**, a new and very active member, has done some much needed maintenance on the boat and the trailer and is now looking into methods of painting the aluminum hull of the vessel which is notorious for being a complicated process.






