



#### 40% by 2030


Produce 40 percent of Virginia's electricity from renewable energy sources by 2030



- 42MW operating in RI and VA
- 10,779MW in permitting phase
- Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind (2,640MW) and Kitty Hawk Offshore Wind (800MW) moved to permitting phase in Dec. 2020



## What Has Changed?



- Vineyard Wind 1 is first project to achieve financial close
- BOEM announced Notice of Intent to prepare EIS for multiple projects
- More certain and timely federal regulatory process
- Federal target to deploy 30GW by 2030
- 11 projects with power purchase agreements or equivalent


# **Port of Virginia Terminals**

- Dedicated offshore wind port




